## **REQUIREMENTS & REGULATIONS**

]	Coal mining and coal yards are regulated by the <b>Ohio Department of Natural Resources Division of Mineral Resources Management</b> . Contact the division at <b>(614) 265-6633</b> for more detailed licensing and permit information. Information is also on-line at <a href="http://minerals.ohiodnr.gov">http://minerals.ohiodnr.gov</a> . *Remember to check local government agencies.*
]	Contact the <b>Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)</b> for information about the proper disposal of hazardous and solid waste. The EPA can be reached at <b>(614) 644-3020 for General Inquiries</b> or <b>(800) 329-7518</b> for <b>Office of Compliance Assistance and Pollution Prevention</b> . The Ohio EPA is also on-line at <a href="www.epa.state.oh.us">www.epa.state.oh.us</a> . *Remember to check local government agencies.*
]	When coal is removed from the ground or water, you must pay excise tax. You will need a severance license. Contact the <b>Ohio Department of Taxation</b> at <b>(888) 405-4039 for Business Tax Assistance; 888-405-4089 for Tax Registration; or (800) 282-1782 for the Forms Request Line</b> . Information is also on-line at <a href="http://www.tax.ohio.gov">http://www.tax.ohio.gov</a> .
]	Storage tanks must be inspected before use. Contact the local fire authority or the <b>Ohio Department of Commerce, State Fire Marshal.</b> The State Fire Marshal's Office can be reached at <b>(614) 752-8200, or (888) 252-0803</b> and is also on-line at <a href="https://www.com.state.oh.us/fire">www.com.state.oh.us/fire</a> . *Remember to check local government agencies.*
