REQUIREMENTS & REGULATIONS

A mentally retarded person "means a person having significantly sub average general intellectual functioning existing concurrently with deficiencies in adaptive behavior, manifested during the developmental period" **ORC** (**Ohio Revised Code Section 5123**). The **ORC** can be found in your local library and are on-line at http://codes.ohio.gov/orc.

The **Ohio Department of Development Disabilities (DODD)** is responsible for overseeing a statewide system of supports and services for people with development disabilities and their families.
