- [] A Freight forwarder is an Export Power of Attorney and must have one of these forms:
 - **Blanket Use** (multi-shipment use)
 - Unlimited Duration (no ending date)
 - Limited Duration (state ending date)
 - Single Shipment Use
 - Shipper's letter of Instruction (SLI)
 - Transportation Provider's bill of lading
 - Signed statement of Invoice
