1st STOP CHECKLIST: HOSPICE

REQUIREMENTS & REGULATIONS

- [] A hospice is "a coordinated program of home, outpatient, and inpatient care and services that is operated by a person or public agency that provides the following care and services to hospice patients...in order to meet the physical, psychological, social, spiritual, and other special needs that are experienced during the final stages of illness, dying, and bereavement:
 - 1) Nursing care by or under the supervision of a registered nurse;
 - 2) Physical, occupational, or speech or language therapy..;
 - 3) Medical social services by a social worker under the direction of a physician;
 - 4) Services of a home health aide;
 - 5) Medical supplies, including drugs and biologicals, and the use of medical appliances;
 - 6) Physician's services;
 - 7) Short-term inpatient care;
 - 8) Counseling for hospice patients and hospice patients' families;
 - 9) Services of volunteers under the direction of the provider of the hospice care program;
 - 10) Bereavement services for the hospice patients' families"

(Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Section 3712.01)
