## Checklist

You must be certified as a <i>Notary Public</i> by a judge of an Ohio Court of Appeals or Common Pleas. You must be an Ohio resident and 18 years or older. Contact the Clerk of Court for the Court of Appeals or Common Pleas of the county in which you reside, or the local Bar Association.
The Ohio Secretary of State (www.OhioSOS.gov) controls the Notary Public documentation. The Notary Commission maintains records all the registered Notaries in Ohio.
