1st STOP CHECKLIST: TRUCKING PRIVATE (IN-STATE/LONG DISTANCE)

Private trucking businesses haul their own property in their own or rented trucks. In-state trucking is also known as **INTRASTATE** trucking. Long distance truck services (traveling in and out of state) are also known as **INTERSTATE** trucking.

REQUIREMENTS & REGULATIONS

[]	For more information, consult the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Section 5577 and 4513.01 to 4513.37 . Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Section 4901:2-1 to 4901: 2-21 . The ORC and OAC can be found in your local library or on-line at http://codes.ohio.gov .
[]	Trucking companies must register with the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio's (PUCO) Motor Carrier Division . The registration forms are attached and can also be found on-line. Private Motor Carrier Safety Rules can also be found on the PUCO web site at www.puco.ohio.gov . If you have questions about registration requirements, contact the Motor Carrier Division.
[]	If you will haul hazardous material, you must register with the Alliance for Uniform Hazmat Transportation. If you have questions, contact the PUCO.
[]	The PUCO's Motor Carrier Division can be reached at (800) 686-7826 or (614) 466-3392 and found on-line at www.puco.ohio.gov .
[]	If you will tow oversize loads, you will need a special hauling permit from the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) . Contact ODOT's main office at (614) 351-2300 or your ODOT District Office for more information. Permit and fee information can also be found at www.dot.state.oh.us/permits/
[]	Trucks that travel <i>outside</i> of the state must have an Ohio International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA) Account with the Ohio Department of Taxation. Forms are attached and can also be found at: http://www.tax.ohio.gov/excise/motor fuel.aspx . If you have questions, contact the Ohio Department of Taxation's Fuel Use Tax Section can be reached at (888) 405-4039 or (614) 466-3410/
[]	The Motor Fuel Tax is a n excise tax applies to all dealers in motor vehicle fuel on the use, distribution, or sale within Ohio of fuel used to generate power for the operation of motor vehicles. Information can be found at the ORC on-line at http://codes.ohio.gov/orc/5735
[]	You need a commercial driver's license . Contact the Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) at (614) 752-7800 for more information. The BMV is on-line at www.bmv.ohio.gov .
