SBDC Network Spotlight



Ohio was in the spotlight at the U.S. Small Business Administration's National Awards Ceremonies this month. First up was EarthQuaker Devices, the Akron manufacturer of guitar pedals that won the award for Small Business Exporter of the Year. EarthQuaker has exported almost since its inception in 2004. Its export initiatives have grown with the help of the SBDC and the Export Assistance Network. EarthQuaker has taken advantage of our Export Internship Program and the International Market Access Grant for Exporters, or IMAGE. It also has used the SBA's Gold Key program.

Next up was the Small Business Development Center at Youngstown State University, which received the national SBDC Excellence and Innovation Award. Director Patricia Veisz and Export Assistance Network Director Mousa Kassis traveled to Washington, D.C., to accept the award. In 2018, the SBDC at Youngstown State University devoted 7,035 counseling hours to assisting 279 clients, helping small businesses generate more than \$96.87 million in new sales, creating 491 jobs and retaining 1,496 jobs. The center connected companies to \$17.51 million in capital infusion.




IBISWorld
